




Homecoming Game -





PHYSICAL EDUCATION






SCIENCE



FOODS I


This is an introductory class emphasizing nutritional choices, food safety, basic food preparation and presentation, kitchen management, med planning, and the ministry of hospitality.


MATH

King had a career-high 16 kills, four blocks and hit a robust .609.


"Carly was just a monster up there, which was nice to see," Assumption coach Bre Scherler said.

Julien Broderson


One of the most dominant high school wrestling careers in Quad-Cities history ended with his arm raised as another state champion.

Broderson recorded a 16-0 technical fall win over Central Lyon's Kolton Bus in the Class 2A 195-pound final to become just the second three-time state champion for the Knights.

Boys' Soccer Takes Runner-up at State

The Assumption Boys' Soccer Team earned a return trip to the Iowa Class 1A State Tournament in Des Moines, marking the second straight season the boys team has advanced to play at the Jam W Cownie Soccer Complex in Des Moines.

Under longtime head coach, Greg Zeller, the Knight ballted against Gilbert in the quarterfinals before falling 1-0 in double overtime. A 2-0 district final win over West Liberty, along with a 2-1 substrate victory over Dubuque Wahlert, propelled Assumption to back-to-back state tournaments for the first time since the Knights made six consecutive trips from 1998 to 2003.

Following the season, senior Trent Fitzpatrick, who is now Assumption's all-time leader in career goals with 66, was named All-lowa Class 1A by the Des Moines Register. Fitzpatrick, along with fellow seniors Sam Moore and Jon Bassier, were voted First Team All-Conference by the MAC Coaxhes, while Senior Augustine Rosas and junior goalkeeper Gaige Ash were Second Team picks. The Knights finished the year 12-9 overall and return a strong group of underclassmen next year.

GIRL'S STATE SOCCER



The Assumption Girl's Soccer Team won its third consecutive Iowa Class 1A State Tournament title, marking the program's seventh state title in the last eight years. With a dominiating 8-0 championship game win over Bishop Heelan (Sioux City) on June 9th at the James W. Cownie Soccer Complex in Des Moines. The Knights now own nine Iowa Class 1A State Titles, matching Cedar Rapids Xavier for the most girls soccer state tournament championships in state history.

Making their 12th straight appearance at the State Tournament, the Knights broke their previous state record for goals scored in the state tournament, with 21 goals in wins over North Polk (8-0 in the quarter-finals), Center Point-Urbana ((5-1 in the semi-finals) and Bishop Heelan (8-0). The 21 goals topped the old mark of 14 set by the Knights at the 2017 State Tournaments.

Juniors Carly King and Anna Vonderhaar were named to the 1A All-Tournament Team, as were seniors Bridget Poster and Molly Gervase (tournament captain for the second straight year).


Following the tournament, Gervase, King, and Poster were voted 2018 Iowa Class 1A First Team All-State by the IGCA. THE GREAT OCEAN cleanup

In September of 2018, after five years of research and testing, the world's first ocean cleanup system was launched from San Francisco Bay. The 600 meter long boom uses oceanic forces to round up plastic waste that litters the ocean. After a two week trial 350 miles into the Pacific ocean, it was confirmed that System 001 could travel the remaining 800 nautical miles to the Great Pacific Garbage Patch, one of five vast garbage patches that exist in the earth's oceans. Using science, meteorology and engineering, teams have figured out how to make the ocean currents work to their advantage and help clean up the plastic that litters, literally, every ocean.
